Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,
Dear friends of our sport,

The FIL Executive Board met in Imst/AUT for its fall meeting on September 23-24, 2022.

The focus of the discussions was the preparation of the upcoming season as well as the appointments of the various FIL Expert Commissions and the working groups "SLIDE 2026". Russia's war against Ukraine and its effects on our sport, together with the energy crisis, were also on the list of topics.

During the two days of meetings, various resolutions were passed.

I would like to inform you about several important decisions which were made:

- **Athletes' prize money artificial and natural track for the 2022/23 season**
(see enclosures 1 and 2)

The athletes' prize money was increased by about 10%.

- **Appointment of the officials (FIL representatives) for the 2022/23 season artificial track and natural track**

The organizers of the competitions and the officials have already been or will be informed separately.

- **Appointments of the various FIL Expert Commissions**

- **New FIL working group "Gender Equality"**

Alex Gough/CAN was appointed as chair of this working group. Ms. Gough will propose the other members of this working group.

- **FIL Safe Sport working group**

Steve Harris/CAN recently successfully completed the training to become a certified "**Safeguarding Officer in Sport**". He will **be in charge of the "FIL Safe Sport" area** for the FIL and, together with a small working group, will develop a step-by-step plan for the implementation of all relevant topics in the FIL.

Steve Harris has the ideal prerequisites for this task due to his many years of relevant professional experience.

We will inform you separately about the details and we ask now for your support for this important project.

- **Advertising space on the sled for artificial track – clarification**

At the recommendation of the VP Marketing Th. Schwab, the executive board approved a **clarification of §7, 2.8 of the IRO artificial track** (*see enclosure 5*).

- **Transport costs subsidies artificial track**

Please find the **transport costs subsidies approved** by the FIL executive board in *enclosure 6*.

We would also like to provide you with the following information:

- **Matthias Böhmer** will be an **assistant to the artificial track directors** in the 2022/23 season. On the one hand, this is intended to relieve the workload of the directors, but on the other hand, it is also intended to compensate as well as possible for a possible unavailability of one of the two directors.

In addition, Mr. Böhmer will also take over the COVID-19 agendas of the FIL at the FIL competitions of the general class.

- COVID-19: We must all be aware that the pandemic is not over yet. Currently, the FIL is not planning any rules or restrictions that go beyond the requirements of the respective organizers / authorities. However, we ask to note that the situation may change again at any time and stricter COVID-19 protective measures may become necessary again.

We strongly recommend that you **make your own arrangements regarding entry requirements (COVID-19 vaccinations, COVID-19 tests)** before you travel to one of the FIL competitions.

- **The qualification procedure for the Youth Olympic Winter Games 2024** in PyeongChang/KOR begins this season. Please find the qualification details in *enclosure 7* and on the FIL website at <https://www.fil-luge.org/cdn/uploads/final-gangwon2024-qs-fil-lug-v01-3.pdf>.

- The **2022 edition of the IRO** will be sent to the NFs upon order. The current IROs are available on the FIL website as PDF files for download:

- We would like to point out once again that an **electronic FIL license** must be applied for all FIL competitions (AT+ NT) starting with the Youth A class. It is not possible to register for a FIL competition in the age groups Youth A, Juniors, General Class without an electronic license.
License fee per athlete and sport year: € 10.
The invoice will be sent by the FIL office at the end of the season.

- The **upcoming election of the athletes' representatives** according to the FIL Statutes will take place at the FIL World Championships 2022 (artificial track in Oberhof/GER as well as natural track in Vatra Dornei /ROU). The athletes can nominate their candidates at the first World Cup of the coming season (artificial track: Innsbruck/AUT - natural track: Winterleiten/ AUT). **Each athlete in artificial track can nominate one (1) male and one (1) female athlete representative for the Sport Commission and the Technical Commission Artificial Track, respectively, and each athlete in natural track can nominate one (1) male and one (1) female athlete representative for the Commission Natural Track.**
We ask you to inform your athletes accordingly already now.
More detailed information will follow through the FIL office. In addition, the current athlete representatives are available to answer any questions.

- The **71st FIL Congress** will take place in **Bucharest/ROU** on **Saturday June 17, 2023 and on Sunday June 18, 2023**.
The schedule in preparation of the 71st FIL Congress was approved by the Executive Board (*see enclosure 8*).

- The **commission meetings** will take place in St. Leonhard near Salzburg/AUT **on March 31, 2023**.



ADVERTISEMENTS ON THE SLED

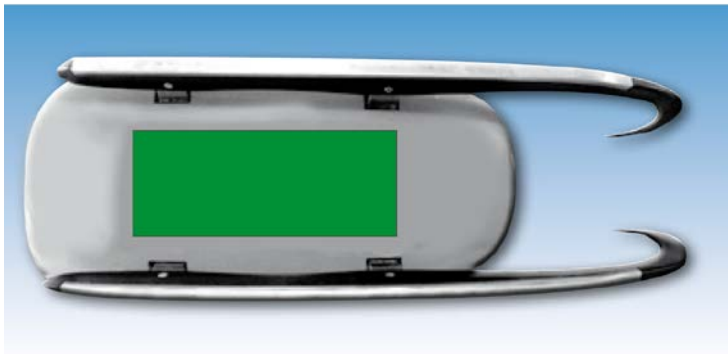


In addition to the manufacturer's trademark, a maximum of six other trademarks may be placed on the entire sled. Of these, a maximum of three may be placed on the underside of the pod. The size of the advertising space must not exceed 1000 cm². The underside of the pod is defined from the high points of the pod downwards.

Max. 3 trademarks may also be placed on the top side of the shell. The total size of these must not exceed 600 cm². The top of the pod is the surface of the top view of the pod.

In addition to this, the manufacturer's trademark may be applied in a max. size of 100 cm², or two times 50 cm² on the runners.

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions,

including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, as well as with the rules of the International Federation of Luge (FIL), may participate in the YOG.

C.1. AGE REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible to participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games Gangwon 2024, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2006 and 31 December 2009.

C.2. ADDITIONAL IF REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible to participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games Gangwon 2024, all athletes must achieve the minimum Standard of FIL, as stated below:

Athletes/Doubles must have participated in a total of at least three (3) races either in the Continental Cup, Youth A World Cup, Junior World Cup or World Cup in the General Class during the pre-Youth Olympic (2022/2023) season and the Youth Olympic season (1 October 2023 until 10 December 2023). During these 2 periods, athletes/doubles must have obtained a minimum of 10 World Cup points accumulated in the Continental Cup, Youth A World Cup, Junior World Cup or World Cup in the General Class races. At least one (1) of these races must be completed during the Youth Olympic Season 2023/2024 until 10 December 2023.

The list of eligible athletes/doubles that fulfil the minimum Standard of FIL will be published on <https://www.fil-luge.org/>.

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country is allocated a quota of six (6) athletes, one (1) man and one (1) women for the Singles event and two (2) men and two (2) women for the Doubles event. The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the Host NOC while respecting the eligibility criteria as detailed in **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

E. Confirmation Process for Quota Places

Following each qualification event, the FIL will publish the Youth A World Cup Rankings on its website (www.fil-luge.org).

FIL shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through **D.1** and **D.2** within two (2) days after the publication of the Youth A World Cup Overall Rankings as described in D.1.1 and D.2.1 on 10 December 2023. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm to the FIL and Gangwon 2024 Sport Entries if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in **G. Qualification Timeline**.

F. Reallocation of Unused Quota Places

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated in the following order:

- 1st priority : Reallocation to the next best ranked NOC that has not been allocated a quota, whose athlete/doubles has achieved the minimum standard of FIL according to **D.1.1** or **D.2.1** per event per gender.
- 2nd priority: Reallocation to the next best ranked NOC that has already been allocated one (1) quota with the second (2nd) best athlete/doubles whose athlete/doubles has achieved the minimum standard of FIL according to **D.1.1** or **D.2.1** per event per gender.

If, following the priorities listed above, there are still unused places in a specific event, the FIL may increase the number of athletes participating in the other events within the framework of the IOC quota for Luge of 100 athletes, according to the following criteria:

- A. The unused quota places may be allocated within the gender:

For example:

- Only 10 Women's Doubles out of the Maximum 15 Women's Doubles Quota Places are filled. This means that there are 10 women athlete quota places not used. These unused quota places can be allocated only to the Women Singles provided that the total quota for the Women of 50 is not exceeded and the total quotas of 100 is not exceeded.
- Only 10 Men's Doubles out of the Maximum 15 Men's Doubles Quota Places are used. This means that there are 10 athlete men quota places not filled. These unused quota places can be allocated only to the Men Singles, provided that the total quota for the Men of 50 and the total quotas of 100 is not exceeded.

- B. Secondly, if it is not possible to reallocate equally by gender taking into consideration that the Youth A World Cup Singles Overall Ranking and the Youth A World Cup Doubles Overall Ranking are exhausted and there are no more eligible athletes in the respective gender and event to reallocate the quota to, then the remaining unused quota places may be allocated to the event that had the largest number of sleds racing in any Youth A World Cup race in the YOG season up until 10 December 2023.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACE

If the Host Country qualifies through **D.1** and/or **D.2** or if it declines any of its quota places, then quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next best ranked NOC in the specific event as described in section **F. Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places**.
